### **(PDF) Self-efficacy and academic performance**

Academic self-efficacy has been reported to promote academic achievement directly and also indirectly by increasing academic aspirations and prosocial behavior. The results of a meta-analysis showed that self- efficacy was related to academic performance.

### **Academic Self-Esteem, Academic Self-Efficacy and Academic ...**

Empirical studies consistently demonstrate that academic self-efficacy is related to a number of academic performance outcomes, including retention/persistence and GPA (Larson et al., 2014, Lent et al., 1986, Robbins et al., 2004, Wright et al., 2012). Academic self-efficacy is also indirectly related to academic performance.

### **Self-efficacy, self-discipline and academic performance ...**

The Pearson correlation coefficient was used to see the relationship between self-efficacy and academic performance. The analysis of the data indicated that students' level of self-efficacy is high (average=45) and a significant relationship exists between self- efficacy and academic achievement ( $r=0.286$ , at 0.05 level).

### **The Relationship between Self-Efficacy and Academic ...**

Descriptive and inferential statistics were used to analyze the differences and relationship between academic self-efficacy and academic performance among university undergraduate students. The results obtained revealed that there is a statistically significant relationship between academic self-efficacy and academic performance among university undergraduate students ( $r(293) = .816$ ,  $p < .01$ ).

### **ACADEMIC SELF-EFFICACY AND ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE AMONG ...**

Consequently, self-efficacy is another factor that is likely to be considered as a variable defining and determining academic performance. Self-efficacy refers to a student's belief in his or her capacity to execute behaviors necessary to produce specific performance attainments (Bandura, 1977).

### **Relationship between Self-efficacy and Academic ...**

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In line with these findings, Schunk and Zimmerman (1994, cited by Mousoulides & Philippou, 2005) reported that there was a positive relationship between self-efficacy and academic achievement and that if students are trained to have higher self-efficacy beliefs their academic performance also improves. Most researchers investigating the relationship between self-efficacy and performance have reported a strong correspondence (Pajares and Miller, 1994).

### **The Relationship between Self-Efficacy and Academic ...**

The findings revealed that, 80.82% of the respondents have higher levels of academic self-efficacy in the College. Also positive and significant relationship between academic self-efficacy beliefs with students' academic performance ( $r=0.342$ ,  $p<0.01$ ) were recorded.

### **Gender Differences Towards Self-Efficacy And Academic ...**

This study investigated relationships between self-efficacy, self-esteem, previous performance accomplishments, and academic performance among a sample of 205 postgraduate students. Participants completed measures of past performance accomplishments, self-esteem, and self-efficacy at the start of a 15-week course.

SELF-EFFICACY AND ACADEMIC SUCCESS 13 Studies indicate that "perceived self-efficacy occupies a central role in the causal structure of social cognitive theory because efficacy beliefs affect adaptation and change not only in their own right, but through their impact on other determinants" (Bandura et al., 2001, p. 188).

### **The Correlation Between Self-Efficacy and the Academic ...**

A significant positive relationship ( $p<0.01$ ) was found between self-esteem, self-efficacy, and academic performance among adolescents. Conclusion: Females are better at self-esteem, self-efficacy, and academic performance. Family income influences self-esteem. Self-esteem and self-efficacy are positively related to academic performance.

Attention has been given to academic self-efficacy (ASE) in educational psychology as an influential factor to enhance academic performance. Consequently, previous studies that have examined the relationship between ASE and online academic performance are reviewed and future directions discussed.

Academic self-efficacy and optimism were strongly related to performance and adjustment, both directly on academic performance and indirectly through expectations and coping perceptions (challenge-threat evaluations) on classroom performance, stress, health, and overall satisfaction and commitment to remain in school.
